Whereas:

1. In the matter between Hetty Van Brandenburg, Brigitte De Roter, Peggy Faulhaber, Helena Kemper, Gusta Peters, Heidi Reinardy, Michael Reinardy, Roland Sallman, Anja Strum, Michelle Strum ("The Plaintiffs") and Camphill Community Clanabogan NIC101781 ("The Charitable Company") 2025 No: 3017 ("the Proceedings").

2. Having considered an application from the Plaintiffs to authorise the Proceedings in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland ("the High Court"), pursuant to s.54(2) of the Charities Act (NI) 2008 ("the Act"), seeking the following relief:

- An Order pursuant to s.306 of the Companies Act 2006 ordering the holding of an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Charitable Company;
- Directions as to the time and place of such Extraordinary General Meeting should be held, as to the advertisement or notification of the said meeting, and as to the conduct of the said meeting;
- An Order pursuant to section 306 of the Companies Act 2006 rectifying and/or restating the Charitable Company's register of members to include the Plaintiffs;
- Leave pursuant to s.54 of the Act to commence and continue the proceedings;
- All necessary and consequential directions;
- Further or other relief;
- Costs; and

3. Being satisfied that the relief sought by Order of the High Court constitutes "charity proceedings" pursuant to s.54(8) of the Act which requires prior authorisation by the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland ("the Commission") pursuant to s.54(2) of the Act, and;

4. Being satisfied that the Plaintiffs named in the Proceedings are persons interested in the charitable company, pursuant to s.54(1) of the Act, and;

5. Being satisfied that, it is appropriate to authorise the taking of the Proceedings, notwithstanding the powers conferred on the Commission under the Act.

The Commission, by this Order authorises the Proceedings by the Plaintiffs.
